



James currently has well over 300,000 cataloged and indexed images in his continually-growing archive.

Nuclear Enchantment

August 2 - January 30, 2022

About the Exhibition

This year, the Museum Association purchased famed photographer Patrick Nagatani's portfolio, Nuclear Enchantment. We're excited for this work to go on display in our photography gallery August 5.

Over a 40-year career Patrick Nagatani (1945-2017) created a diverse body of work that pushed the contours of photography. Constant themes of his work include truth in photography, the looping of time back on itself, magic realism, visual joy, apocalyptic moments, atomic bombs, photographic puns, color for healing, and Japanese internment. In Nuclear Enchantment Nagatani continued to fabricate reality as he explored the true after-effects of uranium mining, radioactive mine tailings, missiles, and nuclear waste. In his artist statement, Nagatani wrote, "My intentions are to raise public consciousness about the effects of New Mexico's nuclear industry that continues to grow despite the damage it has already caused and will continue to bring to the state. The series, Nuclear Enchantment, attempts to awaken the many New Mexicans who still believe nuclear power poses no threat and that defense spending promotes the economy. Culturally and geographically connected to New Mexico, it is perceived by the elite powers as a place that can be abused and even reduced to rubble."

Born Dry: Prohibition in Oklahoma

About the Exhibition

Featuring 25 black-and-white photographs taken during the decades-long fight over prohibition in Oklahoma, this exhibit explores the debate over the legality of alcohol sales through historical imagery.

When Oklahoma became a state in 1907, prohibition was accepted as part of the state's constitution. Despite changing national views on prohibition first with the 18th Amendment instating prohibition in 1919 and then the 1933 passage of the 21st Amendment repealing prohibition—the fight over liquor laws and efforts to control bootlegging remained steady in Oklahoma. In 1958 J. Howard Edmondson was elected governor of Oklahoma. Edmondson believed that Oklahomans should either vote to legalize the sale of liquor or do without all illegal liquor in the state. His appointment of Joe Cannon as commissioner of public safety led to the infamous "Cannon raids" on established businesses across Oklahoma. Soon, a special election for the repeal of prohibition was set and on April 7, 1959, statewide prohibition was repealed, and laws returned to local option.

This exhibit opened in November 2020 and will run for one year in the Chesapeake Event Center and Gallery, which is used for meetings and events. Visitors are encouraged to call in advance to make sure the room is open to the public on the day of your visit.

Professional Photographer Sam Hyden will be providing instruction for portrait lighting and posing.

Club members will display Tabletop set-ups demonstrating different lighting for small still-life photography and various Portrait Lighting setups. Visitors are encouraged to bring their cameras!!!

Providing Answers to Photographers for Over 19 Years...

Today's Question

Can Lightroom Classic show me only photos captured with the selfie lens (or the main lens) the way I can in the Apple Photos application?

Tim's Quick Answer:

Yes, you can filter images in Lightroom Classic based on which lens was used, which in the case of a smartphone means you can filter based on images captured with the "front" camera (such as for selfies) or the "rear" camera (for "normal" captures).

More Detail:

Lightroom Classic includes a wide variety of options for filtering your photos, which can be tremendously helpful for locating a specific image. As I often say, with the various metadata filtering options there's a good chance you can locate a photo based on whatever details you can actually remember about the image.

This filtering includes the option for showing only photos captured with a specific lens. For smartphones that generally include both a front and a rear lens, you can filter images based on which of those lenses were used to capture photos. That means you can effectively filter based on photos captured with the "selfie" lens versus the normal lens.

Not all capture attributes are included in the filtering options in Lightroom Classic, which does create some limits for smartphone captures. For example, you can't filter images captured as a Live Photo or in Portrait mode for iPhone captures, nor can you easily filter images captured as panoramas.

However, despite the limitations, the filtering options within Lightroom Classic do provide very effective options for locating specific photos.
